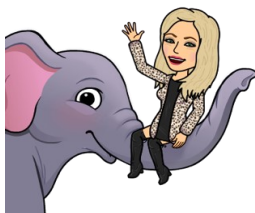
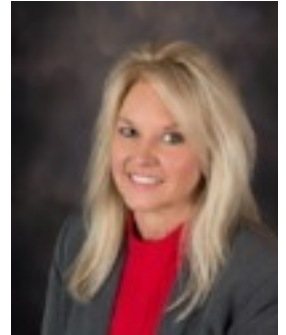
A Message from our President, Debbie Duke

Fun and Informative New Member Orientation!



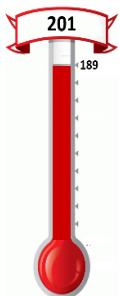

How can I become a delegate representing MCRW at the TFRW State Convention?

First, you must be nominated by a MCRW member (prior consent of the nominee must be obtained).

After the member has consented to be nominated, please email or call Vicky with the nominee's name and contact information.
This should be done by 9/5/2019 for nominee's name to appear on the ballot.

(delegate eligibility – membership dues must be paid for 2019 and you must be a member in good standing)

You MAY nominate yourself!

Second, you must be elected by the membership body at our September General Meeting on 9/10/19.

(To be eligible to vote in club elections, the member must have paid her dues at least 3 days prior to the election and must have attended at least one meeting. There shall be no absentee or proxy voting.)

Note: **We do not have our official delegate number from TFRW yet (due by 8/3/19) but we are expecting 19 delegates and 19 alternates! This would be MCRW's largest delegation to date!

**All members may attend the Convention but only delegates may vote at Convention.

Vote on the slate of new TFRW Officers

Caucus with our SD22 club delegates to elect our new District Director (proxy are not privileged)

Network and exchange ideas with other clubs throughout Texas

Gain exposure to statewide Candidates and Great Speakers.

These past few months we have been focusing on the voices and crusades of people who are really making a difference in the fight for conservative values on different fronts.

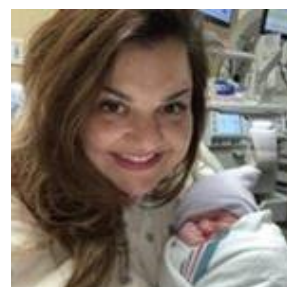
In April we heard from two conservative millennials from Baylor University who head up the Young America's Foundation (YAF) on campus. YAF introduces young people to conservative ideas through conservative conferences, speakers, campus lectures, and initiatives.



Chairman Zack Miller and Vice Chairman Ben Allen spoke to us about the state of conservatism on Baylor campus and answered questions and concerns we had about what is happening there.

Abby spent 8 years working for Planned Parenthood, overseeing 22,000 abortions, until one day she was asked to help with a procedure that opened her eyes to what Planned Parenthood and abortion were really about. We were truly blessed to be the last meeting she spoke at—she was nine months pregnant-- before giving birth to her beautiful baby boy, Fulton on May 31st.

In June we focused on border issues, and who better to fill us in on what it is like at the Texas border than McLennan County Sheriff Parnell McNamara? He regaled us with stories of his own experiences patrolling the border, chasing the drug cartel and attempting to thwart human trafficking as it crossed the state line. Border issues directly affect McLennan county and its citizens and Sheriff McNamara talked about its impact and answered questions we had about the fight to protect our state.

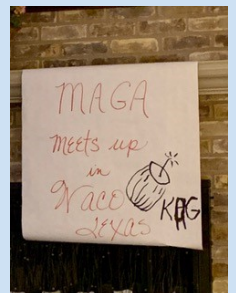
MCRW Leadership Gathered to Watch President Trump Announce his Bid for Re-election

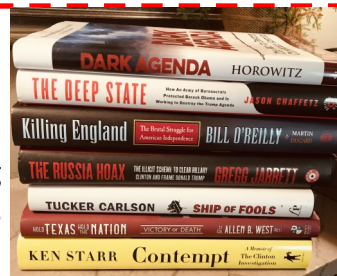
