## Campaign Activities, Angelika Hoeher

In August, I completed the deputy voter registration training and subsequently walked in my neighborhood knocking on doors to encourage neighbors to complete voter registration forms. Many of the people in my neighborhood had moved here since the pandemic hit and needed to submit a change of address to the Elections Office so they could vote in November.



In September, I supported TFRW efforts to get Texans who had changed residency to update their voter registrations. This required hand writing sixty "notes" (which were actually long letters) to individual Texans. I also participated with the group that visited businesses where like-minded customers might shop to distribute the voter registration forms and boxes.

In October, I was asked to provide front-office assistance to Linda Hill at Republican Party Head Quarters. This required keeping the office open until 5 pm and some hours on Saturdays. Anne Grinols and I recruited a group of volunteers who worked with us during the month of October. We were meeting and talking with the public who came in to purchase signs, register to vote, answer questions about the upcoming election or simply express concerns about the direction of our country. The most interesting event, was a call from a 75-year-old veteran on the last day for voter registration. He said he had never registered to vote, since he felt there had been no one worth voting for. Due to a physical limitation, he was unable to drive to headquarters that day, so I drove to his house in McGregor so he could complete the voter registration form. As a voter registration deputy, I was able to help him register to vote.

In addition to writing post cards to prospective Georgia voters, my husband Michael and I became part of The Mighty Texas Strike Force. We travelled to Newnan, GA after Christmas to block walk and speak with Georgians who had not yet voted. Since we were in rural GA, our task was more like block driving, as houses were widely spaced apart. Once we mentioned that we were volunteers from Texas we received a warm Georgia welcome! We also attended a quickly scheduled rally for Senator Kelly Loeffler in Newnan, GA.
