Fox News Anchor Kayleigh McEnany Speaks to a Sold-Out Crowd at the McLennan County Republican Women Event

WACO, TX March 25, 2022: Fox News anchor and former press secretary to President Trump, Kayleigh McEnany was the guest speaker Saturday, March 19th at the Baylor Club in Waco. Over 300 people attended the McLennan County Republican Women sold-out event where McEnany took pictures with guests and signed her new book, *For Such a Time As This, My Faith Journey Through the White House and Beyond*. Dignitaries in attendance included state and local elected officials.



McEnany spoke about her positive personal experiences in the Trump administration. She told of how her father influenced her leadership skills as she entered the White House and took on her role as Press Secretary in a hostile media environment. She ended her speech on an inspirational note saying that she knew God put her in the public eye for such a time as this, quoting from the book of *Esther*.

Kayleigh graduated from Harvard Law School with a Juris Doctor and Georgetown University School of Foreign Services with a degree in international politics. She also studied politics and international relations at Oxford University, St. Edmunds Hall. Prior to working in the White House, Kayleigh worked as the National Press Secretary for the Trump Campaign and formerly the National Spokesperson for the Republican National Committee. Before joining the RNC, Kayleigh worked as a political commentator at CNN and across cable news. She is currently a co-anchor of *Outnumbered* on Fox News Channel.
